The Level of Care Utilization System (LOCUS) - Washington, D.C.

Persons with chronic deficits with no acute changes in status are given a 3 – do not compare them to a baseline or ideal. Don't confuse this with risk of harm. This is not a measurement of risk of harm but rather changes in status. Dimension 1 looks at functioning only where it puts the individual in harm's way.
